Heifer International has been helping to end hunger and poverty since 1944 and because of this millions of families have been able to lift themselves out of poverty. This project provides struggling families all around the world with the gifts of livestock and training in their care. With a little help, it doesn't take long before a family soon has milk to drink, food to eat and enough left over to sell at market. And because of the principle of "passing on the Gift, each recipient family passes on the gift of their animal's offspring to another family in need.

The amount raised by you here at Anderson Grove for the Heifer Project was \$1,225.21.

The Session members carefully reviewed the choices available and decided what animals they thought would do the most good for the people.

- 2 Goats @ \$120.00 each. Goats give families rich, nutritious milk and can thrive in many of the harshest climates.
- 2 Pigs @ \$120.00 each. Pigs are easy to care for, and because they take up very little space they make a perfect gift for a farmer with a modest piece of land.
- 2 Water Buffalo @ 250.00 each. A water buffalo is really three gifts in one—tangy milk to drink, draft power to help plow a field and organic fertilizer to help improve crop yield.
- 3 Honeybees @ \$30.00 each. Honeybees are easy to care for and take up little space-plus their delicious honey can be sold at market to help increase a family's income.
- 6 Hens @ \$20.00 each. A single hen can lay hundreds of eggs each year. Each hen is another lifesaving gift for a hungry child.
